Materials should be accurate and complete. Information should be completed in an easy-to-read 12 point font with one-inch margins and double-spaced.

A. COVER PAGE – Introduction to who you are. Emphasize your degree of involvement in your home farm operation, or other dairy/ag operations including specific responsibilities. Other suggested topics include details of farm, acres, milking set-up, herd, feed, facilities, your current Holstein Junior involvement (local, state & national levels) and future plans.

B. SUMMARY OF AGRICULTURE ACTIVITIES & PROJECTS – Arrange in chronological order-most recent year first, this does not have to be double spaced.

1. What three skills have you developed from your Holstein project work that will benefit you later in life?
2. Technology is ever-changing in the dairy industry. If you could pick one new technology to implement on your dairy farm, what would it be and why?

3. If you were asked to give a presentation to a community organization (i.e. Rotary, Kiwanis) how would you communicate what dairy farming is like today?
4. What is the most important job you perform on your farm and why?
